THE ST ALBANS CITY AND DISTRICT COUNCIL (CONTROL OF PARKING) ORDER 2023 (AMENDMENT NO.13) WAITING RESTRICTIONS MORRIS WAY ORDER 2026

St Albans City and District Council (pursuant to arrangements made with Hertfordshire County Council), in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police hereby make the following Order:

Citation and Commencement

1. This Order may be cited as “The St Albans City and District Council (Control of Parking) Order 2023 (Amendment No.13) Waiting Restrictions Morris Way Order 2026” and shall come into operation on 12 February 2026.

Interpretation-

2. “**The Order of 2023**” means The City and District of St Albans (Control of Parking) Order 2023.
3. “**On-Street Plans**” means a map showing the specified location/s within the City and District of St Albans and incorporated into this order, unless otherwise indicated.

Amendment of The City and District of St Albans (Control of Parking) Order 2023

4. The Order of 2023 is hereby varied as identified in the on-street plans.
5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
6. The restrictions imposed by this Order and detailed on the on-street plan, shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

ST ALBANS CITY AND DISTRICT COUNCIL

THE ST ALBANS CITY AND DISTRICT COUNCIL (CONTROL OF PARKING) ORDER 2023 (AMENDMENT No.13) WAITING RESTRICTIONS MORRIS WAY ORDER 2026

St Albans City and District Council (pursuant to arrangements made with Hertfordshire County Council) proposes to introduce waiting restrictions in Morris Way under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended).

It is intended that these measures will:

- Improve road safety
- Reduce instances of inappropriate or inconsiderate parking
- Improve visibility at road junctions, and
- Maintain access.

The proposals have been developed following consultation with Residents, Businesses, District Councillors, the Highway Authority, Hertfordshire Constabulary and all other statutory consultees, taking into account Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
